This year, the PVGP is celebrating the 40th annual race through the streets of Schenley park. The festivities start on July 10th with the Kick Off Rally followed by the Historics at Pitt Race on July 14-17th culminating in the Schenley Park Vintage Races and International Car Show on July 23/24th. This year the marquee car will be the Porsche. The best part of this event is all the proceeds go toward the Autisim Society of Pittsburgh and the Merakey Allegheny Valley School.

West Penn Miata Club will get together on Saturday July 23 in the Asian Car Section to enjoy our Miatas and each other's company and watch the only remaining Vintage race still run on city streets. Please go to the registration web page located at <https://pvgp.org/car-show-overview/asian-car-show/> scroll down to the "Showclix" tab. As a special note, scroll down a bit more and you will find a photo of the WPMC tent on the website. The rate will be \$50 for the weekend. Also note that registration closes on July 21 after which the registration fee increases

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to \$60 and you must pay at the gate. The entrance to the International Car Show is at the top of Schenley Drive where it intersects Forbes Avenue in Squirrel Hill, just below the Schenley Park Golf Course Clubhouse. We usually enter at Gate D, but actual instructions will be given on race day. Please note that your receipt will contain a QR code that will be scanned upon entry to facilitate a quick and touchless process. So please print your receipt or save it in your phone and bring it with you. The car shows run from 11:00AM to 5:00PM, Please arrive no earlier than 9:30 AM.

WPMC's main day will be Saturday. We will have a tent and tables set up. Please bring your own lawn chairs and drinks. Food is pot-luck offering from all of us attending. Keep in mind that non-perishable items are best as no refrigeration is available. While snacks are always welcome, we would suggest more covered dishes, given that in the past we ended up with lots of chips and junk food with very little variety. The tent and tables will remain in place for both days for anyone who wishes to attend on Sunday. We will also need folks to take a turn staffing the information and merchandise table during the day. It has been many years since I visited the Flight 93 Memorial. My recent visit to the Memorial Park was surprising because of the size, magnitude and solemnity of what is now a National Park dedicated to the victims of that day.

The total time at the memorial will be about one and a half to two hours. We will attend a 30-minute presentation

at 1:30 by the rangers at the flagpole in the memorial plaza. A walking tour at the memorial plaza near the crash site can be downloaded to smart phones and tablets or dialed up on your cell phone. The visitor center building is very spacious and displays artifacts, exhibits and little-known facts about that fateful day. It also houses a gift shop. The park also includes the tower of voices, a tower that has 40 massive aluminum wind chimes - one chime for each victim. Admission is free to all.

If you enjoy ZOOMING on twisty back roads, please join Mary and me on some of our favorite country routes on August 20. This is a "Dave & Luanne Kopco wannabe cruise" with roads winding through the hills and dales of Southwest PA. (first leg is about 2 hours driving time to Friendship Hill)

Our first stop is at Friendship Hill National Historic Site near Point Marion, PA, for bathrooms and some Western PA history. It was the home of Albert Gallatin, who served as a U. S. Congressman, the longest serving Secretary of the Treasury, and Ambassador to France and Great Britain. (about 45 minute visit) (about 1 and 1/2 hours driving time to Oglebay)

Lunch will be at the Garden Bistro terrace (weather permitting) at Oglebay Park near Wheeling, WV, with

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views of the grounds and Wilson Lodge. No pre-ordering required; if you'd like to view the menu, go to www.oglebay.com/garden-bistro. After lunch, the first ice cream stop (for those ready to leave the cruise) will be at the Farmhouse Sweets & Treats Shoppe next to the Carriage House Shop & Glass Museum, a short walk from the Bistro.

Heading back to our Miatas, we will pass the original farm's greenhouse, guest house and the Mansion Museum, the Oglebay family home. We won't have time to visit the zoo and its train, the Wilson Lodge, Schenk Lake, swimming pool or golf courses this trip. (about 1 and 1/2 hours for lunch) (about 1 and 1/4 hours driving time to Sarris')

On the final leg of the cruise, we will head east to Canonsburg, PA, where Perry Como and Bobby Vinton grew up. For our second and last choice for ice cream, we will stop at Sarris' Old Fashioned Ice Cream Parlor & Candies. We will be near I-79 for heading home.

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
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
